Dynamics: A simple and very pedagogical first presentation by Graciela about minimum income in the EU and Spain (15 minutes). A debate with the parliamentary groups around a question: What position does a party adopt in the development of minimum income policies? and How do they propose to achieve it?

5 minutes for everyone to answer each question, with a space for debate with the public.

Round table, 12.30-13.30: "Minimum income: myths and potentials"

Duration: 1 hour

Participants Fintan Farrell (EMIN Director), Thiago Rocha (Social Intervention Master) and ATTAC representative.

What is sought with this round table is to open a reflection on the myths and potentialities of minimum income policies. Each one would have about 15 minutes to put on the table their reflections, concerns and thoughts on this, to later open a small space for discussion with people who are in the plenary

Dynamic: 10/15 minutes of each person's intervention on the myths and potentialities of minimum income policies, as well as their viability. Subsequent discussion of 15 minutes with audience.

13.30 to 14.15 - ACTIVITIES. In the courtyard of the Center we will have the space of fighting your myths and another space of cardboard to send messages to the citizenship about the minimum income.
